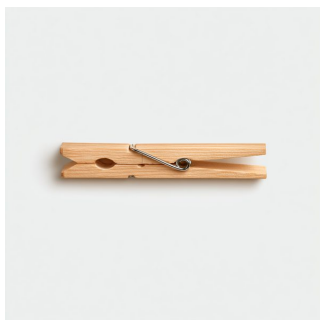




Backup object cards. A printed stand-in for every miniature the shelf asks for — print the ones you could not buy and drop them in the basket beside the real objects. 50 × 50 mm, unmounted: that is the finished card. Twenty-six in all, 15 here and 11 on sheet 2 — cat ×3, pig ×3, hat ×3, dog ×2, sun ×2, mug ×2, bed ×2, and one each of pot, pan, tin, mop, peg, nut, bin, cot and kit. Seven objects are wanted by two or three trays at once, which is the only reason any is printed more than once.

A4 landscape, 300 gsm, single-sided, 100% — never “fit to page”. Matt laminate the whole sheet, then cut. No word is printed on any card: these are sound-box objects and the child names the picture himself.

Cut along every grey line · 15 cards.



Where they go. Tray 1 basket: pig · cat · sun · bed · mug · hat. Tray 2 Set A: cat · pig · dog · pot · pan · tin · mop · peg. Tray 2 Set B: hat · sun · mug · bed · nut · bin · cot · kit. Tray 8 oral game: cat · pig · hat · dog. All eight trays sit on the shelf at once, so an object two trays both want is cut twice.

Eleven cards here. The four empty squares at the end of the grid cut into blank 50 mm cards — keep them as spares for the next object. Same print as sheet 1.

Cut along every grey line · 11 cards.
